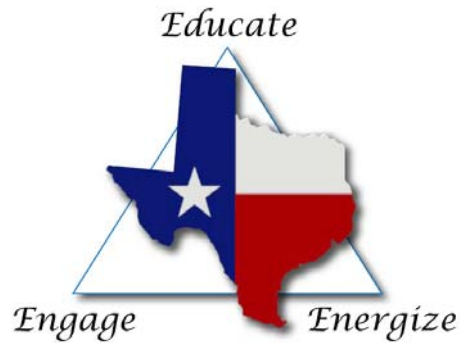

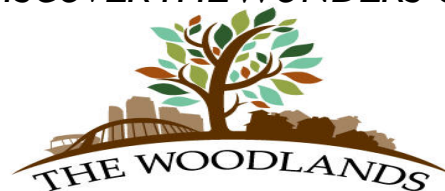

Field Trip #1 – Thursday, April 7, 2011

Halliburton Drill Bits and Services – Bit Manufacturing Facility

Halliburton Sperry Drilling

8:15 am – 4:00 pm Maximum: 30

Cost: Member \$35 / Non-Member \$40 (Lunch included)



Come tour Halliburton's Bit Manufacturing Plant not far from The Woodlands. Enjoy a presentation in Halliburton's conference center on the different bit types and their uses. We will then tour the plant floor and see how bits are made.

After lunch we will then precede to the Halliburton Sperry Drilling facilities in north Houston. Sperry Drilling is involved in Directional Drilling, Drilling Optimization, Measurement While Drilling, Logging While Drilling, Surface Data Logging, Optimized Pressure Drilling, Multilateral Systems and Real-Time Services.

Travel with us to Cameron's Technology Development Center to learn about drilling and production systems, valves and measurement, and compression systems. We will have a presentation and tour of their facilities which includes the Showcase used for training and education with full sized sectioned models of actual oil tool equipment, along with the Test Lab where initial product conceptualization through prototype build and test verification is done. After lunch we will travel to one of National Oilwell Varco's locations in north Houston. A presentation will be given on bits, borehole enlargement and advanced drilling solutions. We will then tour their facilities.

“Land 101: An Introduction”

Have you ever wondered what the Landmen in your company do? When they are not on the golf course that is. This talk will provide the attendee with a basic overview of what is involved in being a Landman. Topics covered will include types of ownership interests (including working interest, royalty interest, and mineral interests), differences in company and field landmen, and standard contractual agreements. Differences in land work between asset areas, particularly onshore and offshore will be discussed.

Jennifer Walker spent 4 years as a Landman at ConocoPhillips. During this period she spent 2 years as part of the Deepwater Gulf of Mexico Exploration team and 2 years as part of the Panhandle Asset team. She had the opportunity to work on various projects including serving as the lead for various offshore lease sales, leading co-owner negotiations, testified before the Oklahoma Corporation Commission, managed a team of brokers, and represented Land on numerous development wells.

Jennifer holds a B.B.A. in Energy Management from the University of Oklahoma, MS in Mineral Economics from Colorado School of Mines and MS in Petroleum Economics and Management from the French Institute of Petroleum. While an undergraduate at OU, she was fortunate to have been awarded several Desk and Derrick scholarships from the ADDC Educational Trust, the Tulsa Club, and the Oklahoma City Club. She is currently working in the Investment Appraisal group of ConocoPhillips.

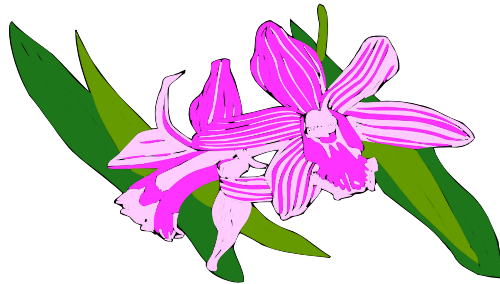
